

Criterion 1.3.4.1 Students undertaking field projects/internships

Additional information:

The curriculum design is such that apart from classroom and practical training students have to take up project work in respective areas and these projects are both in-house and in external organizations. All the students take up project work during their course of study. All postgraduate programs require submission of dissertation as part of their curriculum and hence students have to take up research work in related areas and submit the dissertation at the end of the project. Apart from these students take up internship during their semester break in industries and esteemed organisations for increasing their practical knowledge and experience. Undergraduate students take up short-term research projects and submit the reports in related areas.

Approach

- KAHE encourages students to participate in field work and internship as it provides hands-on learning opportunity for students
- KAHE initiates Collaborations with industries and external organizations to facilitate student and faculty exchange
- Students usually take up internship and project work in these organizations which gives them on-the-job training
